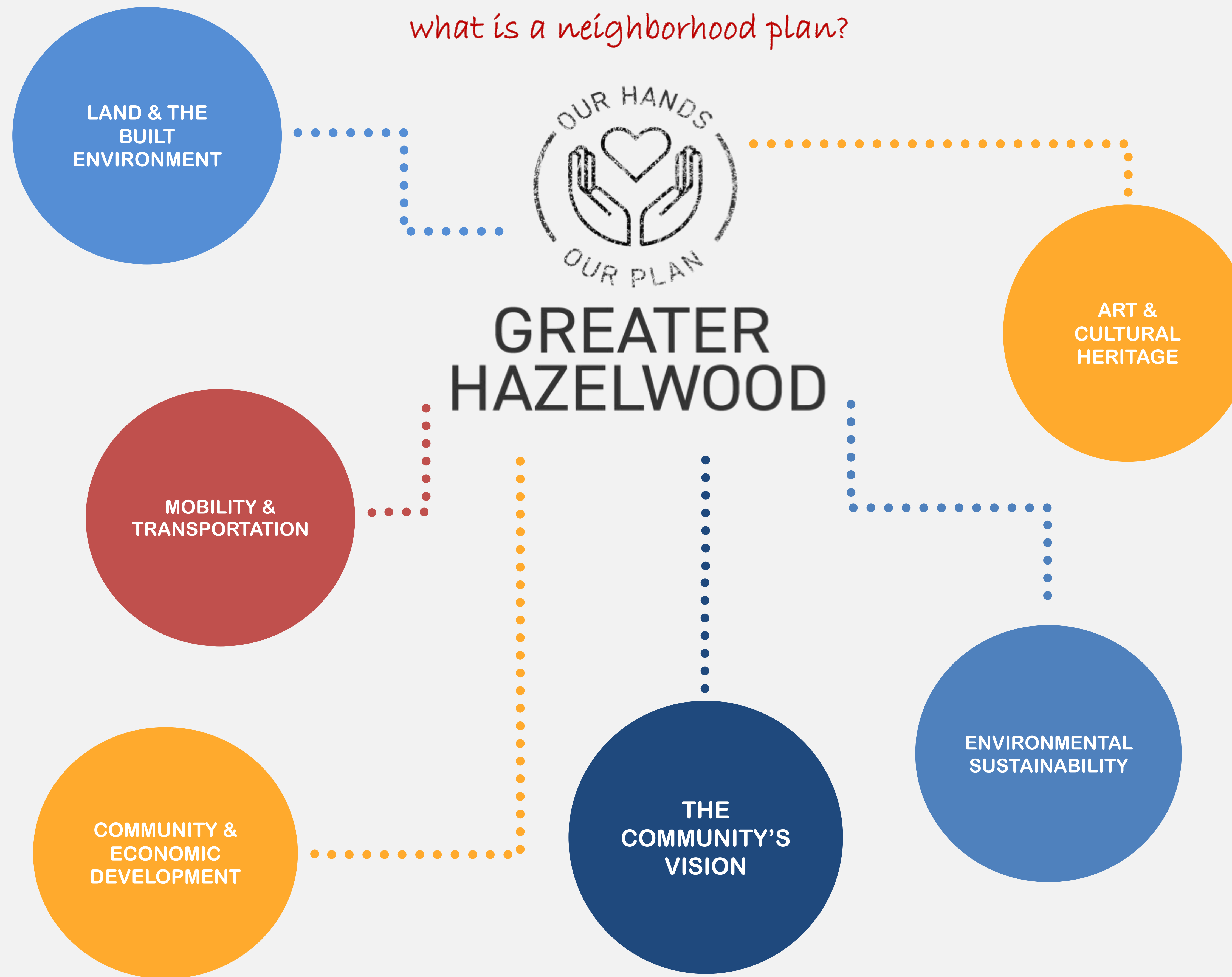

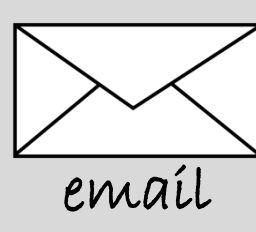

CONVENING OF THE STEERING COMMITTEE

The Steering Committee (formerly the Greater Hazelwood Community Collaborative Planning Committee) and representatives from Pittsburgh City Planning, interviewed & selected a consultant team – Gensler, UrbanKind and Mosaic - to carry out the neighborhood planning process.

COMMUNITY MEETINGS

There will be three community meetings held throughout the planning process. These meetings are meant to provide interactive opportunities for Hazelwood residents and stakeholders to share their ideas, opinions and concerns with the consultant team.

FOCUS GROUPS & INTERVIEWS

UrbanKind will be recruiting participants from the community for focus groups and interviews. The demographics for the focus groups will include: homeowners, residents who rent, parents of school-aged children, youth aged 16-24, seniors, and spiritual leaders/pastors.

COMMUNITY ACTION TEAMS

Community Action Teams will be formed throughout the planning process to establish a resident led effort that will guide, implement, and act as stewards of the Neighborhood Plan for the next 10 years. These teams will act as advocates, utilizing community outreach and organizing to inspire resident participation and ownership of the Plan.

- Community & Economic Development
- Environmental Sustainability
- Land & The Built Environment
- Mobility & Transportation
