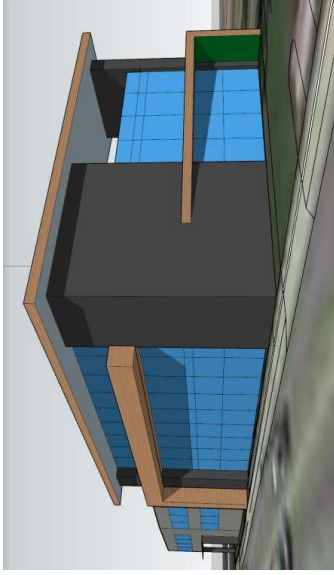

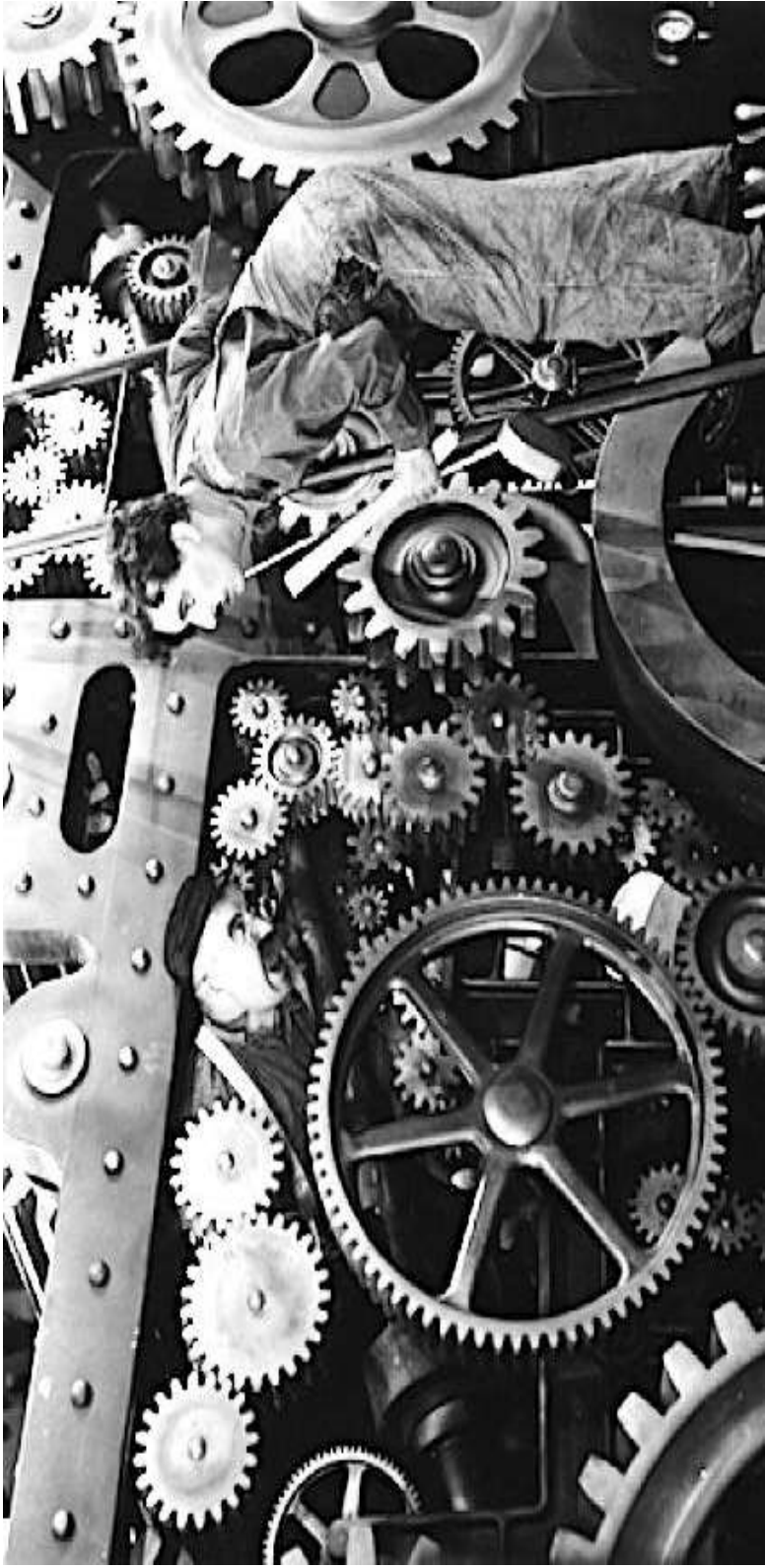

WHAT IS A COOPERATIVE?

A cooperative is a **member-owned enterprise** that operates to achieve **collective economic, social, and/or cultural goals** whose governing decisions are made **democratically by the members.**





Cooperatives are a viable alternative to extractive business practices, giving members control over working conditions, decisions, and the business's impact on their lives.

- 1819: Pittsburgh Manufacturers Association – Wood at 2nd Ave
- 1847: Foundry started by iron moulders – Int'l Co-op Assn of PGH
- 1868: Pittsburgh Cooperative Foundry – Upper Lawrenceville
- 1879: Knights of Labor – foundries and mines – Ohio Valley to NEng
- 1919: Tri-State Cooperative Association – 23 co-op stores
- 1931: The Young Negroes Co-operative League: 1st nat'l conference
- 1937: Penn-Craft Farm and Redstone Knitting Mill, Norvelt Co-op
- 1950's & 60's post-war economic boom – few but consumer co-ops
- Post “Great Recession”: a resurgence in cooperative formation

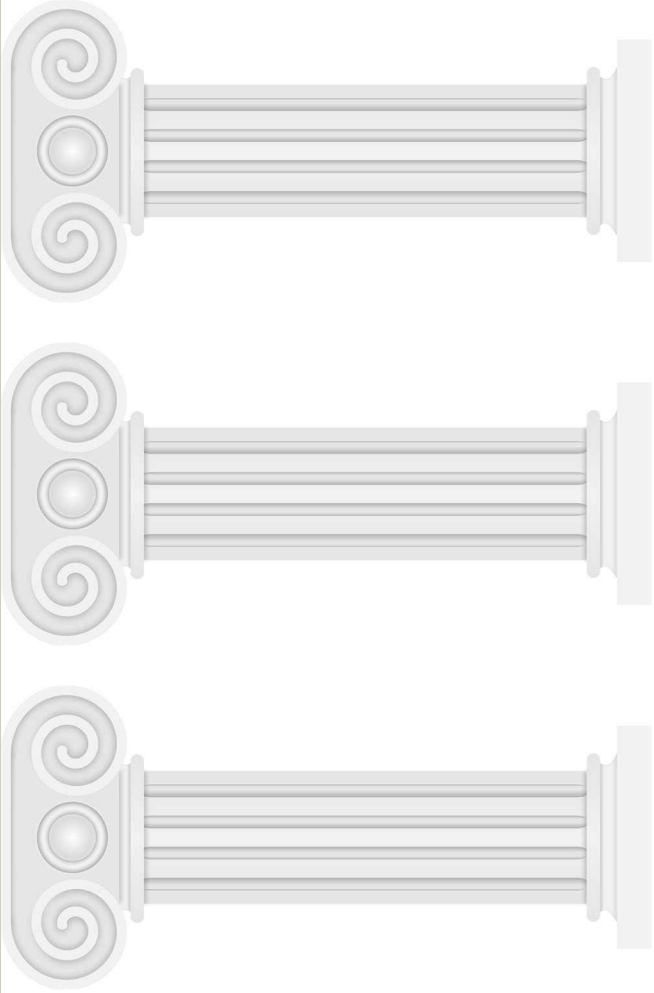

Project Update

Project Overview – Equity One Stop Shop Resource Center Recap

Restore and renovate the former Good Shephard Church to serve the community in many different ways:



Project Execution Recap

This project will be treated in 3 phases:

- Phase 1: Acquisition of the property – **Completed November 2022**
- Phase 2: Occupancy of the property for Praise Temple Deliverance Church and commence housing renovations – **Renovations underway on the house. Scoping of renovations for church occupancy underway.**
- Phase 3: Renovation of the property to support the full Equity One Stop Shop vision – **Planning underway with phased contract scopes under development.**

Project Developments

- Funding secured for property acquisition and housing renovations via URA Acre Loan and PHLF Loan
- Property acquired in November 2022 by POORLAW-Praise Temple partnership
- Housing renovations commenced in January 2023
- EOSS project selected for a \$500K RCAP Grant
- Planning commenced on RCAP bid packages – Priority projects include HVAC overhaul, roof renovations, and painting
- Tenant planning to commence within the next month

Project Next Steps

- Complete housing renovations and secure a tenant
- Develop RCAP Request for Proposals and commence bidding activities
- Secure bridge funding to support RCAP contract execution
- Develop tenant plan and progress tenant space configuration
- Continue to pursue funding sources for full EOSS build-out
